Code for Prohibition of Insider Trading and Code of Fair Disclosure of Unpublished Price Sensitive Information

Preamble and Applicability

The Code of **Shradha Infracore Limited [Formerly known as Shradha Infracore (Nagpur) Limited]** ("**Code**") is framed by to regulate, monitor and report trading by insiders. This "Code" is intended to prevent misuse of Unpublished Price Sensitive Information ('UPS') by insider and connected persons and ensure that Directors and Specified Persons of the Company and their Dependents shall not derive any benefit or assist others to derive any benefit from access to and possession of price sensitive information about the Company which is not in the public domain, that is to say, insider information. The Code approved and adopted by the Board of Directors of the Company at its meeting held on 15th September 2017 and revised on 18th September 2020.

The Code shall be applicable to and binding on all Specified Persons as defined in Clause 1.22.

1. Definitions

- 1.1 "**Act**" means the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992.
- 1.2 "**Board**" means the Board of Directors of the Company.
- 1.3 "**Code**" or "**Code of Conduct**" shall mean the Code of Internal Procedures and Conduct for Regulating, Monitoring and Reporting of trading by insiders of Shradha Infracore Limited [Formerly known as Shradha Infracore (Nagpur) Limited] as amended from time to time.
- 1.4 "**Company**" means Shradha Infracore Limited [Formerly known as Shradha Infracore (Nagpur) Limited].
- 1.5 "**Compliance Officer**" means a **Company Secretary** or such other senior officer, who is financially literate and is capable of appreciating requirements for legal and regulatory compliance under these regulations designated so and reporting to the Board of Directors and who shall be responsible for compliance of policies, procedures, maintenance of records, monitoring adherence to the rules for the preservation of unpublished price sensitive information, monitoring of trades and the implementation of the Code specified in these regulations under the overall supervision of the Board of Directors of the Company.

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1.6 “Connected Person” means :-

- (i) any person who is or has during the six (6) months prior to the concerned act been associated with the Company, directly or indirectly, in any capacity including by reason of frequent communication with its officers or by being in any contractual, fiduciary or employment relationship or by being a director, officer or an employee of the Company or holds any position including a professional or business relationship between himself and the Company whether temporary or permanent, that allows such person, directly or indirectly, access to unpublished price sensitive information or is reasonably expected to allow such access.
- (ii) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, the persons falling within the following categories shall be deemed to be connected persons unless the contrary is established :-
 - (a) an immediate relative of connected persons specified in clause (i); or
 - (b) a holding, associate or subsidiary company; or
 - (c) an intermediary as specified in Section 12 of the Act or an employee or director thereof; or
 - (d) an investment company, trustee company, asset management company or an employee or director thereof; or
 - (e) an official of a stock exchange, clearing house or corporation; or
 - (f) a member of board of trustees of a mutual fund or a member of the board of directors of the asset management company of a mutual fund or is an employee thereof; or
 - (g) a member of the Board of directors or an employee, of a public financial institution as defined in Section 2(72) of the Companies Act, 2013; or
 - (h) an official or an employee of a self-regulatory organization recognised or authorized by the Board; or (i) a banker of the Company; or
 - (i) a concern, firm, trust, hindu undivided family, company or association of persons wherein a director of the Company or his immediate relative or banker of the Company, has more than ten per cent, of the holding or interest.

1.7 “Dealing in Securities” means an act of subscribing to, buying, selling or agreeing to subscribe to, buy, sell or deal in the securities of the Company either as principal or agent.

1.8 “Designated Employee(s)” shall include :-

- (i) every employee in the grade of Manager and above;
- (ii) every employee in the finance, accounts, secretarial and legal department as may be determined and informed by the Compliance Officer; and

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- (iii) any other employee as may be determined and informed by the Compliance Officer from time to time.
- 1.9 **“Director”** means a member of the Board of Directors of the Company.
- 1.10 **“Employee”** means every employee of the Company including the Directors in the employment of the Company.
- 1.11 **“Generally available Information”** means information that is accessible to the public on a non-discriminatory basis.
- 1.12 **“Immediate Relative”** means a spouse of a person, and includes parent, sibling, and child of such person or of the spouse, any of whom is either dependent financially on such person, or consults such person in taking decisions relating to trading in securities.
- 1.13 **“Insider”** means any person who is :-
- (i) a connected person; or
 - (ii) in possession of or having access to unpublished price sensitive information.
- 1.14 **“Key Managerial Person”** means a person as defined in Section 2(51) of the Companies Act, 2013.
- 1.15 **“Promoter”** shall have the meaning assigned to it under the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Issue of Capital and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2018 or any modification thereof.
- 1.16 **“promoter group”** shall have the meaning assigned to it under the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Issue of Capital and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2018 or any modification thereof;
- 1.17 **“Securities”** shall have the meaning assigned to it under the Securities Contracts (Regulation) Act, 1956 (42 of 1956) or any modification thereof except units of a mutual fund.
- 1.18 **“Takeover regulations”** means the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Substantial Acquisition of Shares and Takeovers) Regulations, 2011 and any amendments thereto.
- 1.19 **“Trading”** means and includes subscribing, buying, selling, dealing, or agreeing to subscribe, buy, sell, deal in any securities, and "trade" shall be construed accordingly.
- 1.20 **“Trading Day”** means a day on which the recognized stock exchanges are open for trading;
- 1.21 **“Unpublished Price Sensitive Information”** means: any information, relating to a company or its securities, directly or indirectly, that is not generally available which upon becoming generally available, is likely to materially affect the price of the securities and shall, ordinarily including but not restricted to, information relating to the followings:-
- (i) financial results;
 - (ii) dividends;

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- (iii) change in capital structure;
 - (iv) mergers, de-mergers, acquisitions, delistings, disposals and expansion of business and such other transactions;
 - (v) changes in key managerial personnel; and
- 1.22** “**Regulations**” shall mean the Securities & Exchange Board of India (Prohibition of Insider Trading) Regulations, 2015 and any amendments thereto.
- 1.23** “**Specified Persons**” means the Directors, connected persons, the insiders, the Designated Employees and the promoters and immediate relatives are collectively referred to as Specified Persons.

Words and expressions used and not defined in these regulations but defined in the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992 (15 of 1992), the Securities Contracts (Regulation) Act, 1956 (42 of 1956), the Depositories Act, 1996 (22 of 1996) or the Companies Act, 2013 (18 of 2013) and rules and regulations made there under shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them in those legislation.

2. Role of Compliance Officer

- 2.1.** The Compliance Officer shall, under the supervision of the Board and the Committee, be responsible for compliance of policies, procedures, maintenance of records, monitoring adherence to the rules for the preservation of UPSI, monitoring of Trades as per the Code and implementation of the Code, maintaining records of the Designated Persons (and their Immediate Relatives) and any changes made in the list of Designated Persons (and their Immediate Relatives) and providing guidance and clarifications sought regarding the SEBI Regulations and the Code;
- 2.2.** The Compliance Officer shall submit such reports to the Board and in particular, Audit Committee of the Board, including reports in relation to Trading by Designated Persons, every quarter, to enable them to review compliance with the provisions of this Code and SEBI Regulations and to verify that the systems for internal controls are adequate and are operating effectively;
- 2.3.** The Compliance Officer shall assist all employees in addressing any clarifications regarding the Securities & Exchange Board of India (Prohibition of Insider Trading) Regulations, 2015 and the Code of Conduct.

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3. Preservation of "Price Sensitive Information"

3.1 All information shall be handled within the Company on a need-to-know basis and no unpublished price sensitive information shall be communicated to any person except in furtherance of the insider's legitimate purposes, performance of duties or discharge of his legal obligations. Unpublished price sensitive information may be communicated, provided, allowed access to or procured, in connection with a transaction which entails:-

- an obligation to make an open offer under the takeover regulations where the Board of Directors of the Company is of informed opinion that the sharing of such information is in the best interests of the Company; or
- not attracting the obligation to make an open offer under the takeover regulations but where the Board of Directors of the Company is of informed opinion that the sharing of such information is in the best interests of the Company and the information that constitute unpublished price sensitive information is disseminated to be made generally available at least two trading days prior to the proposed transaction being effected in such form as the Board of Directors may determine to be adequate and fair to cover all relevant and material facts.

However, the Board of Directors shall require the parties to execute agreements to contract confidentiality and non-disclosure obligations on the part of such parties and such parties shall keep information so received confidential, except for the limited purpose and shall not otherwise trade in securities of the Company when in possession of unpublished price sensitive information.

3.2 Need to Know:-

- (i) "need to know" basis means that Unpublished Price Sensitive Information should be disclosed only to those within the Company who need the information to discharge their duty and whose possession of such information will not give rise to a conflict of interest or appearance of misuse of the information.
- (ii) All non-public information directly received by any employee should immediately be reported to the head of the department. 3.3 Limited access to confidential information Files containing confidential information shall be kept secure. Computer files must have adequate security of login and password.

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3.3 Limited access to confidential information

- i. Files containing confidential information shall be kept secure. Computer files must have adequate security of login and password.
- ii. Structured digital database shall be maintained which contain the names of persons or entities with whom the information is shared. Such databases shall be maintained with adequate internal controls and checks.

3.4 Legitimate Purpose:

An Insider shall not share UPSI with any person including other Insider(s) except where such communication is in the ordinary course of business or on a need-to-know basis and in furtherance of legitimate purposes, performance of duties or discharge of legal obligations.

An Insider before so sharing the UPSI with any other person shall notify him/her that the information is UPSI and to maintain confidentiality of the same. Further, the Insider shall get a Confidentiality Agreement executed by the recipient of UPSI and forward the same to the Compliance Officer.

Designated Persons, who are employees and Directors and bound by the terms of the Code of Conduct in their capacity as employees or Directors, respectively, need not separately execute a Confidentiality Agreement.

Legitimate Purpose shall, inter-alia, include sharing of UPSI on need-to-know basis by an insider with promoters, partners, collaborators, lenders, customers, suppliers, merchant bankers, legal advisors, auditors, insolvency professionals or other advisors or consultants, etc. provided that such sharing has not been carried out to evade or circumvent the prohibitions under these Regulations.

In following cases which are illustrative in nature, sharing of UPSI would be considered as legitimate purpose:

- i. For investigation, inquiry or request for information by statutory or governmental authorities or any other administrative body recognized by law;
- ii. Under any proceedings or pursuant to any order of courts or tribunals;

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- iii. As part of compliance with applicable laws, regulations, rules and requirements;
- iv. Arising out of any contractual obligations or arrangements entered by the Company set forth in any contract, agreement, arrangement, settlement, understanding or undertaking.
- v. Arising out of business requirement including requirement for the purposes of promoting business of the Company, strategies of business, statutory consolidation requirements or related customary disclosure obligations which may require sharing of UPSI with any outsider or Promoter of the Company, who in turn may share it with their Promoter(s) as well as with their advisors, consultants, intermediaries, fiduciaries, etc.
- vi. Sharing the relevant UPSI by Company or Promoter for advice, consultation, transaction support, valuation, fund raising or other intermediation and approvals in relation to the subject matter of:

Any person in receipt of unpublished price sensitive information pursuant to a "legitimate purpose" shall be considered an "insider" for purposes of these regulations and due notice shall be given to such persons to maintain confidentiality of such unpublished price sensitive information in compliance with these regulations.

4. Trading when in possession of unpublished price sensitive information:

- 4.1. No insider shall trade in securities that are listed or proposed to be listed on a stock exchange when in possession of unpublished price sensitive information.

5. Prevention of misuse of "Unpublished Price Sensitive Information":

Employees and connected persons designated on the basis of their functional role ("designated persons") in the Company shall be governed by an internal code of conduct governing dealing in securities.

5.1. Trading Plan

An insider shall be entitled to formulate a trading plan for dealing in securities of the Company and present it to the Compliance Officer for approval and public disclosure pursuant to which trades may be carried out on his behalf in accordance with such plan.

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5.2. Trading Plan shall:

- (i) not entail commencement of trading on behalf of the insider earlier than six months from the public disclosure of the plan;
- (ii) not entail trading for the period between the twentieth trading day prior to the last day of any financial period for which results are required to be announced by the issuer of the securities and the second trading day after the disclosure of such financial results;
- (iii) entail trading for a period of not less than twelve (12) months;
- (iv) not entail overlap of any period for which another trading plan is already in existence;
- (v) set out either the value of trades to be effected or the number of securities to be traded along with the nature of the trade and the intervals at, or dates on which such trades shall be effected; and
- (vi) not entail trading in securities for market abuse.

The Compliance Officer shall consider the Trading Plan made as above and shall approve it forthwith. However, he shall be entitled to take express undertakings as may be necessary to enable such assessment and to approve and monitor the implementation of the plan as per provisions of the Regulations.

The Trading Plan once approved shall be irrevocable and the Insider shall mandatorily have to implement the plan, without being entitled to either deviate from it or to execute any trade in the securities outside the scope of the trading plan.

However, the implementation of the trading plan shall not be commenced, if at the time of formulation of the plan, the Insider is in possession of any unpublished price sensitive information and the said information has not become generally available at the time of the commencement of implementation. The commencement of the Plan shall be deferred until such unpublished price sensitive information becomes generally available information. Further, the Insider shall also not be allowed to deal in securities of the Company, if the date of trading in securities of the Company, as per the approved Trading Plan, coincides with the date of closure of Trading Window announced by the Compliance Officer.

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Upon approval of the trading plan, the compliance officer shall notify the plan to the stock exchanges on which the securities are listed.

6. Trading Window and Window Closure

- 6.1**
- (i)** The trading period, i.e. the trading period of the stock exchanges, called 'trading window', is available for trading in the Company's securities.
 - (ii)** The trading window shall be, inter alia, closed at least 7 days prior to and during the time the unpublished price sensitive information is published.
 - (iii)** When the trading window is closed, the Specified Persons shall not trade in the Company's securities in such period.
 - (iv)** All Specified Persons shall conduct all their dealings in the securities of the Company only in a valid trading window and shall not deal in any transaction involving the purchase or sale of the Company's securities during the periods when the trading window is closed, as referred to in (ii) above or during any other period as may be specified by the Company from time to time.
 - (v)** In case of ESOPs, exercise of option may be allowed in the period when the trading window is closed. However, sale of shares allotted on exercise of ESOPs shall not be allowed when trading is closed.
- 6.2** The Compliance Officer shall intimate the closure of trading window to all the designated employees of the Company when he determines that a designated person or class of designated persons can reasonably be expected to have possession of unpublished price sensitive information. Such closure shall be imposed in relation to such securities to which such unpublished price sensitive information relates.
- 6.3** The Compliance Officer after taking into account various factors including the unpublished price sensitive information in question becoming generally available and being capable of assimilation by the market, shall decide the timing for re-opening of the trading window, however in any event it shall not be earlier than forty-eight hours after the information becomes generally available.
- 6.4** The trading window shall also be applicable to any person having contractual or fiduciary relation with the Company, such as auditors, accountancy firms, law firms, analysts, consultants etc., assisting or advising the Company.

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Pre-clearance of trades

6.5 All Specified Persons, who intend to deal in the securities of the Company when the trading window is opened and if the value of the proposed trades is above 50,000 shares or up to Rs. 10 Lakhs (market value) or 1% of total shareholding, whichever is less, should pre-clear the transaction. However, no designated person shall be entitled to apply for pre-clearance of any proposed trade if such designated person is in possession of unpublished price sensitive information even if the trading window is not closed and hence he shall not be allowed to trade. The pre-dealing procedure shall be hereunder:

- (i)** An application may be made in the prescribed Form (Annexure 1) to the Compliance officer indicating the estimated number of securities that the Specified Employee intends to deal in, the details as to the depository with which he has a security account, the details as to the securities in such depository mode and such other details as may be required by any rule made by the company in this behalf.
- (ii)** An undertaking (Annexure 2) shall be executed in favour of the Company by such Specified Employee incorporating, inter alia, the following clauses, as may be applicable:
 - (a)** That the employee/director/officer does not have any access or has not received "Price Sensitive Information" up to the time of signing the undertaking.
 - (b)** That in case the Specified Employee has access to or receives "Price Sensitive Information" after the signing of the undertaking but before the execution of the transaction he/she shall inform the Compliance Officer of the change in his position and that he/she would completely refrain from dealing in the securities of the Company till the time such information becomes public.
 - (c)** That he/she has not contravened the code of conduct for prevention of insider trading as notified by the Company from time to time.
 - (d)** That he/she has made a full and true disclosure in the matter.
- (iii)** All Specified Persons shall execute their order in respect of securities of the Company within one (1) week after the approval of pre-clearance is given. The Specified Person shall file within two (2) days of the execution of the deal, the details of such deal with the Compliance Officer in the prescribed form. In case the transaction is not undertaken, a report to that effect shall be filed. (Annexure 4).
- (iv)** If the order is not executed within seven (7) days after the approval is given, the employee/director must pre-clear the transaction again.

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- (v) All Specified Persons who buy or sell any number of shares of the Company shall not enter into an opposite transaction i.e. sell or buy any number of shares during the next six months following the prior transaction. All Specified Persons shall also not take positions in derivative transactions in the shares of the Company at any time. In case of any contra trade be executed, inadvertently or otherwise, in violation of such a restriction, the profits from such trade shall be liable to be disgorged for remittance to the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) for credit to the Investor Protection and Education Fund administered by SEBI under the Act. In case of subscription in the primary market (initial public offers), the above mentioned entities shall hold their investments for a minimum period of thirty (30) days. The holding period would commence when the securities are actually allotted.
- (vi) The Compliance Officer may waive off the holding period in case of sale of securities in personal emergency after recording reasons for the same. However, no such sale will be permitted when the Trading window is closed.

7. Other Restrictions

- 7.1 The disclosures to be made by any person under this Code shall include those relating to trading by such person's immediate relatives, and by any other person for whom such person takes trading decisions.
- 7.2 The disclosures of trading in securities shall also include trading in derivatives of securities and the traded value of the derivatives shall be taken into account for purposes of this Code.
- 7.3 The disclosures made under this Code shall be maintained for a period of five (5) years.

8. Reporting Requirements for transactions in securities

Initial Disclosure

- 8.1 Every promoter/ Key Managerial Personnel / Director / Officers / Designated Employees of the Company, within thirty (30) days of these regulations taking effect, shall forward to the Company the details of all holdings in securities of the Company presently held by

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them including the statement of holdings of dependent family members in the prescribed Form (Annexure 5).

- 8.2** Every person on appointment as a key managerial personnel or a director of the Company or upon becoming a promoter shall disclose his holding of securities of the Company as on the date of appointment or becoming a promoter, to the Company within seven days of such appointment or becoming a promoter.

Continual Disclosure

- 8.3** Every promoter, employee and director of the Company shall disclose to the Company the number of such securities acquired or disposed of within two trading days of such transaction if the value of the securities traded, whether in one transaction or a series of transactions over any calendar quarter, aggregates to a traded value in excess of Rs. 10 lakhs. The disclosure shall be made within two (2) working days of:

- a. the receipt of intimation of allotment of shares, or
- b. the acquisition or sale of shares or voting rights, as the case may be.

9. Disclosure by the Company to the Stock Exchange(s)

- 9.1** Within two (2) days of the receipt of intimation under Clause 8.3, the Compliance Officer shall disclose to all Stock Exchanges on which the Company is listed, the information received.
- 9.2** The Compliance officer shall maintain records of all the declarations in the appropriate form given by the directors / officers / designated employees for a minimum period of five years.

10. Dissemination of Price Sensitive Information

- 10.1** No information shall be passed by Specified Persons by way of making a recommendation for the purchase or sale of securities of the Company.
- 10.2** Disclosure/dissemination of Price Sensitive Information with special reference to analysts, media persons and institutional investors:

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The following guidelines shall be followed while dealing with analysts and institutional investors

- Only public information to be provided.
- At least two Company representatives be present at meetings with analysts, media persons and institutional investors.
- Unanticipated questions may be taken on notice and a considered response given later. If the answer includes price sensitive information, a public announcement should be made before responding.
- Simultaneous release of information after every such meet.

11. Penalty for contravention of the code of conduct

- 11.1** Every Specified Person shall be individually responsible for complying with the provisions of the Code (including to the extent the provisions hereof are applicable to his/her dependents).
- 11.2** Any Specified Person who trades in securities or communicates any information for trading in securities, in contravention of this Code may be penalised and appropriate action may be taken by the Company.
- 11.3** Specified Persons who violate the Code shall also be subject to disciplinary action by the Company, which may include wage freeze, suspension, ineligibility for future participation in employee stock option plans.
- 11.4** The action by the Company shall not preclude SEBI from taking any action in case of violation of SEBI (Prohibition of Insider Trading) Regulations, 2015.

12. Code of Practices and Procedures for Fair Disclosure of unpublished price sensitive information

This following intends to formulate the policy for fair disclosure of UPSI and the Board of Directors shall adhere to it in letter and in spirit.

Principles of fair Disclosure and Conduct

1. Prompt public disclosure of unpublished price sensitive information that would impact price discovery no sooner than credible and concrete information comes into being in order to make such information generally available.

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2. Uniform and universal dissemination of unpublished price sensitive unpublished price sensitive information to avoid selective disclosure.
3. Designation of a senior officer as a chief investor relations officer to deal with dissemination of information and disclosure of unpublished price sensitive information.
4. Prompt dissemination of unpublished price sensitive information that gets disclosed selectively, inadvertently or otherwise to make such information generally available.
5. Appropriate and fair response to queries on news reports and requests for verification of market rumours by regulatory authorities.
6. Ensuring that information shared with analysts and research personnel is not unpublished price sensitive information.
7. Developing best practices to make transcripts or records of proceedings of meetings with analysts and other investor relations conferences on the official website to ensure official confirmation and documentation of disclosures made.
8. Handling of all unpublished price sensitive information on a need-to-know basis.
9. The Company Secretary & Compliance Officer is designated as Chief Investor Relations Officer of the Company, to deal with dissemination of information and disclosure of UPSI.

Policy for determination of 'legitimate purpose'

1. In terms of the SEBI Regulations, the term "legitimate purpose" is clarified to include sharing of UPSI in the ordinary course of business by an insider with Company's partners, collaborators, lenders, customers, suppliers, merchant bankers, legal advisors, auditors, insolvency professionals or other advisors or consultants, provided that such sharing of UPSI has not been carried out to evade or circumvent the prohibitions of the SEBI Regulations;
2. The SEBI Regulations require the Board to formulate a policy for determination of 'legitimate purpose', in line with the guidance provided in the SEBI Regulations. The assessment of whether sharing of UPSI for a particular instance would tantamount to 'legitimate purpose' would entirely depend on the specific facts and circumstances of each case. Accordingly, this Policy only sets out the principles that should be considered while assessing if the purpose for which UPSI is proposed to be shared is "legitimate";
3. Primarily, the following factors should be considered:
 - whether sharing of such information is in the ordinary course of business of the Company;

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- whether information is sought to be shared to evade or circumvent the prohibitions of the Regulations;
 - whether sharing the information is in the best interests of the Company or in furtherance of a genuine commercial purpose;
 - whether the information is required to be shared for enabling the Company to discharge its legal obligations;
 - whether the nature of information being shared is commensurate to the purpose
 - for which access is sought to be provided to the recipient.
4. It is clarified that in the event there exist multiple purposes for sharing UPSI, each purpose will be evaluated on its own merits, in line with the aforementioned principles;
5. The recipient of UPSI shall be informed of the following, by way of written intimation and/ or contractual agreement, such as, confidentiality agreement or non – disclosure agreement, that:
- the information being shared is UPSI and that the Company is the exclusive owner of such UPSI;
 - upon receipt of UPSI, the recipient would be deemed to be an Insider and subject to the provisions of the SEBI Regulations,
 - the recipient must maintain confidentiality of the UPSI at all times,
 - the recipient may use the UPSI only for the approved purposes for which it was disclosed;
 - the recipient should provide a written undertaking that he/she/it shall not undertake Trades in the securities of the Company while in possession of the UPSI;
 - the recipient must extend all cooperation to the Company, as may be required in this regard, and;
 - the recipient must also adopt a code of conduct in terms of Regulation 9 of the SEBI Regulations, to inter alia ensure that it safeguards the UPSI in line with the SEBI Regulations;
6. The information should be shared by the Company, from time to time, in the ordinary course of its business activities with its advisers and service providers, viz., auditors, merchant bankers and legal advisers/consultants of the Company, in line with the aforementioned principles;

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7. Additionally, the Board, or the Compliance Officer or any person authorised by the Board in this regard, shall be responsible for maintaining structured digital database, in compliance with the SEBI Regulations, comprising necessary details of all recipients of UPSI, who receive UPSI in compliance with the SEBI Regulations, including, name, address, email, Permanent Account Number (PAN), or any other identifier authorised by law (where PAN is not available) and such other documents as may be necessary, in the manner that may be prescribed by the Board or SEBI. In this regard, adequate systems and controls shall be put in place to ensure compliance with the SEBI Regulations towards sharing of UPSI for legitimate purposes.

13. Amendment

The Board reserves its rights to amend or modify the Code in whole or in part, at any time without assigning any reason whatsoever. However, no such amendment or modification will be binding unless the same is notified in writing.

14. Conclusion

All Specified Persons are advised to familiarize themselves with the Regulations and comply with the same, as well as with the Code, both in letter and spirit. Specified Persons are also advised to ensure compliance by their immediate relatives.
